Sister Catherine Maureen O'Halloran, a Sister of Saint Francis of the Neumann Communities (Millvale), passed away on May 29, 2025. She was preceded in death by her parents, Francis & Catherine O'Halloran, and her siblings Frances, Donald, Ronald, Patrick and James. She is survived by her many loving nieces & nephews and longtime friend, Fr. Richard Ward.

Sister Catherine Maureen entered the Sisters of St. Francis of Millvale from St. Mary Parish in Lawrenceville. She obtained a BS in Education from Carlow University, library certification from St. Francis University and a MS in Education from Duquesne University. For over 40 years, she ministered in the elementary schools of the Diocese of Pittsburgh as a teacher, principal and director of religious education programs. She also ministered at Alverno Apartments (Christian housing) and was a local minister for the Sisters at Mt Alvernia. She celebrated her 70th Jubilee in 2024.

Sister Catherine Maureen enjoyed all her years in religious life, especially teaching. She radiated Irish and Franciscan joy to all she met and her Irish eyes were always smiling. "... In the lilt of Irish laughter (thank you, Catherine Maureen) You can hear the angels sing" (and we know you do!)
